BEREAVEMENT COMMITTEE



The bereavement committee has been put in place to help our members families during their darkest hours.

We help them, first of all by phone or sending someone to their home to represent the Order of the Friendly Sons of the Shillelagh and to offer our condolences from each and every member of the club.

We start off by explaining to the family member that this is what we do for each and every member of the Friendly Sons, this is our way of thanking the family for sharing their loved one with us for many years.

Then it is time to get down to business, We now try to find out if the details are finalized for the wake and the funeral, most times they are not. We now ask the family if they would like a piper for the church and cemetery the day of the funeral. The answer usually is yes so we now make a mental note to call the manger of The Friendly Sons of the Shillelagh Pipes and Drums, currently that is John Hatton (2013 Shillelagh of the year). John will then get on the horn and find us a piper for the family, What you may not realize is that on many occasions I have seen these fine gentlemen take a day off of work to make this happen.

We now ask the family if we can help them out with pall bearers and an honor guard comprised of brother Shilllelagh's in full dress uniform, then we let them know that if there is any little thing that we can do to make this difficult time for their family any easier that is what we are here for. Next we explain to them that they are entitled to a repast luncheon at the club for their family and guests, we then need to find out how many guests they are expecting. How is that for a tough question, we usually ask a family member at the wake if they have an idea of how many people to expect at the repast luncheon. No one can really answer that question so we look at the size of the wake and make an educated guess.

For those of you who do not know Barney Shannon one of our charter members orders a large piece of flowers in the shape of a shamrock, for this time is of the essence we have to give the florist enough time to order enough flowers necessary to create our piece. If you know of the passing of a member please contact Barney Shannon as soon as possible, please don't wait for someone else to call him. (732-254-6153).

Next we need to get the word out to hundreds of members, we are now sending it out three ways,

- 1. You will recieve a personal phone call. (many times this is not possible because you got rid of your home phone and are using a cell phone so we can't call you and you won't receive the shout out!)
- **2. You will receive an e-mail notification.** (does the club have your e-mail address?)
- 3. You will then receive a computer generated phone call.

If all else fails you can get the information off the board at the club. The message will explain the member's name, the name of the funeral director, what days and times the wake is, and what time we will be meeting at the club.

Brian Smith makes sure that the flags are lowered to half staff to honor our deceased brother. **We ask you to please attend the wake in full uniform.** As you know we attend the wake to support the family of the deceased at probably the worst time of their lives.

I have personally seen this from both sides as a member of the family of the deceased, and as a club member supporting the family of a deceased member. A member of a family will tell you that the sea of green blazers that was overwhelming the room seemed like it went on forever. Please help to make the family proud at their saddest moment.
