

BELMAR ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

SUNDAY, MARCH 3rd 2013

The day begins with 9:00 AM Mass at the club followed by a Continental Breakfast before Parade Registration. **Buses (6) will leave the club at 11:30 sharp. BUS return: Transportation back to the club is scheduled as follows; 3 buses to depart approx. 2:00 PM directly after the parade, 1 bus will depart at 3:00 PM, LAST BUS HOME will depart at 4:00 PM. Please limit any accessory to those in good taste. If you have a question on something you would like to wear, please check with the Parade Adjutant, President, or Marshals to see if the item is acceptable. Smoking and drinking is not allowed during the march, you must step-off with the club. You will not be allowed to jump in line as we pass any local taverns you may have been in. You may be censured for this. Please do not embarrass the Friendly Sons or yourself. Proper conduct is expected at all times. **Remember, you are representing the finest Irish-American Club in the world. The spectators and other marchers deserve your courtesy and respect.**
