IRISHMAN OF THE YEAR



He was born in Mount Vernon, New York in 1935, and lived there except for a two year period spent living in Blackstone, Mass. His family then moved to Bayside, Queens, N.Y., where he attended St. Michael's Grammar School in Flushing.



Having Two Uncles who were Irish Christian Brothers, he naturally went to All Hallows High School in the Bronx. He worked for Union Carbide in Manhattan before enlisting in the Army during The Cold War. He served from 1955-1958 in the Signal Corps, where he fought the battle of Baguettes and Wine in Bordeaux, France for 27 months.

After being discharged from the Army, he took what he thought was a temporary job with United Airlines at Idlewild Airport. Forty three years later, he retired. He started as a Ramp Serviceman, and moved up to become the IAM Union Representative, serving in that position for over 35 years.

While working at Idlewild, he met a girl who was geographically correct. She lived-in Queens, not the Bronx. He married Kathleen in 1963. They both transferred their jobs to Newark Airport, and they bought a home in Old Bridge. Fifty years later, the family consists of their 4 children, Noreen, Patrick, Eileen, and Brian, and 11 Grandchildren!. He also has three sisters, Liz, Maryjo, and Maureen.

He joined the FSOS in 1970. Throughout the years, he has held several offices in the club and was President for 4 years. At one point in time, he wrote The Shenanigans, and also helped or organized many dances, anniversaries, picnics, pancake breakfasts, and golf tournaments, as well as our Mass before the parade etc. He also heads up the Flags And Banners crew for our Pipes And Drums Band. He's been active with The Belmar Parade Committee (now Lake Como), for approximately 20 years. In 2002, he was selected as Grand Marshall of The Belmar St. Patrick's Day Parade
